



LANDS ADJOINING ST COLMAN'S CEMETERY

St Peter's Parish continues to be very concerned about the misuse of parish land adjoining St Colman's Cemetery and Tarry Lane. Scramblers and other vehicles have been regularly breaking entry, trespassing on this property and effectively using it as a form of racing circuit. These activities, and the noise generated because of them, have been a major annovance to visitors to St Colman's, residents in the Tarry Lane area and, on occasions, those attending burial services at the cemetery. The Parish wishes to make it very clear that no member of the public has ever been given permission to use its property in this way and deplores the upset caused by these intruders. It has pointed this out on several occasions to those involved in the scrambling and has asked them, unsuccessfully, to end their activities. If you know any of

the people involved and feel that you could persuade them as to the consequences of their unwanted, anti-social activity, the Parish would welcome your support and input in helping to resolve this difficult and
