POINTS TO PONDER

Much of what drives us today is based on image. How we will appear to others can seem more important than reality. We see this with fake Instagram accounts, fake followers, fake articles and overblown personal stories on social media, with the many filters on our phone cameras and the lengths we go to in order to get more followers. This way of living has seeped into our consciousness. The way of Christ is a different way in which we are asked to be humble and selfless, not in a rose-tinted capacity but in a real way, a way that can hurt us, away in that some capacity mirrors Jesus's walk to Calvary. Just like with our phone filters, it is very easy to sentimentalise Christianity.

There is no evidence to suggest that Jesus was sentimental. His message went to the core of our being, and today in the beatitudes he is asking for some of the humility that he has shown when he died for our sins. We have been asked to re-appraise where we are in our faith path. Where we go from here is anyones guess. But with the Gospels as our signposts, we have a wonderful opportunity to grow as disciples of Jesus and live as though within the beatitudes.
