#### **FEAST DAYS DURING THIS WEEK**

Tuesday 22 October - St John Paul II - was Pope for over twenty-six years, from October 22 1978, the inauguration of his ministry as universal Pastor of the Church, until his death on 2 April 2005. Ordained Bishop of Krakow in 1958 and took a significant art in the Second Vatican Council, As Bishon of Rome he visited almost all of the Roman parishes ad made apostolic journeys to 104 countries including Ireland.

### Wednesday 23 October - St John of

Capistrano, priest studied civil and canon law and joined the Franciscan Order. A Faithful servant of four popes, he attended the Council of Florence, went to Jerusalem as anostolic emissary and in 1451 set out on a preaching tour through the German provinces and Poland. Patron saint of jurists and military chaplains.

# **Thursday 24 St Anthony Mary Claret**

Founded the Claretians in Spain for missionary work. Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, then returned as chaplain to the Queen of Spain and built schools and museums before being exiled with the monarchy.

Friday 25 October - Blessed Thaddeus MacCarthy, bishop He set out as a humble pilgrim

to Rome where he was confirmed as Bishop of Cork and Cloyne. On his return journey in 1492 he died at Ivrea in Italy.

One day a little girl was misbehaving at home. She was the youngest in the family, and over the years her parents, as well her brothers and sisters had spoiled her without realizing it. Because she was so used to getting her own way, she often sulked or threw a tantrum when things didn't suit her. One day, in an effort to teach her some manners, her mother told her to go and sit in the corner until her father arrived home. The little girl went over and stood in the corner, and in a symbol of rebellion, she refused point blankly to sit down on the chair.

The mother decided that she was not going to be dictated to by a five-year-old, and after some sharp words, and might I add a little hassle, she finally managed to get her daughter to sit. A short while later the little girl's father arrived. He immediately noticed that his daughter was sitting in the corner with her arms folded and with her right foot tapping on the ground. When he asked her what she was doing, she replied, 'Well, on the outside I'm sitting down, but on the inside, I'm still standing!'

'Spoiled little girl,' we might say, but aren't we all good at externals? How many of us can be seen to do the right thing all because we're under pressure to conform, but, yet in our hearts there's something totally different going on. Surely we must admire the innocence of the little girl who told the truth? Come on, let's be honest (like the child was), how many of us who profess to love our neighbours actually do?
