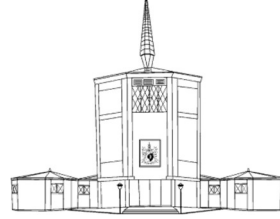


# SAINT PAUL'S PARISH, SHANKILL

### FEAST DAYS DURING THE WEEK

#### Monday 24 June The Nativity of St

**John the Baptist** - We rejoice at the coming of St John the Baptist, a man of self-denial, integrity of life and purpose and an uncompromising prophetic voice. John means "The Lord has shown favour". This feast related to the summer solstice when the days begin to grow shorter calling John's words, "He must increase but I must decrease".

**Thursday 27 June - St Cyril of Alexandria, bishop and doctor of the Church** - St Cyril 376-444, patriarch of Alexandria, fought against Nestorianism at the Council of Ephesus, 431 which proclaimed Mary, the Mother of God.

**Friday 28 June - St Irenaeus Bishop and Martyr** - lived just after the time of the apostles and knew those who had seen and talked with them. He became Bishop of Lyons. The desire to win people to Christianity by love rather than by fear, was apparent in all of Irenaeus' work.

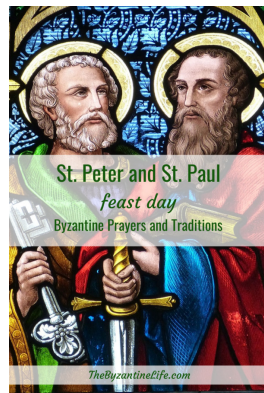

### FEAST OF ST PETER AND ST PAUL

On this day, traditionally considered in pagan Rome to be its foundation day by Romulus, we celebrate the twin founders of the Church in Rome.

Saint Peter and Saint Paul Day is observed every year on June 29. The event is the liturgical feast day that honours two martyrs of the Christian faith,

**St. Peter** originally called Simon, a fisherman who became leader of the apostles and the rock on which the Church is built, died by crucifixion in Rome around the 64.

**St. Paul** Saul the Pharisee who because the 'Apostle of the Gentiles', was martyred by beheading around 67.

Both proclaim with their lives that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God Although the church acknowledges they may not have been executed at the same time, both met death at the command of the Roman emperor – Nero.

The date chosen is the traditional anniversary of their death and martyrdom. The event is a significant religious occasion in Rome, and the catholic parishes around the world hold masses to commemorate the day.
