FEAST DAYS DURING THIS WEEK

Monday 27th January - St Angela Merici, virgin and religious: was founder of the Ursulines, devoted herself to Christian education based on love, kindness with firmness and concern for the individual.

Tuesday 28th January St Thomas Aquinas Priest and Doctor of the Church - was born in Italy in 1224. He died in 1274. Thomas taught that Christian revelation and human knowledge are aspects of a single truth and cannot be in conflict with one another. One of the greatest theologians, he is patron of schools, university, students and booksellers.

Thursday 30th January - St Aidan, Bishop was born around 550 probably in Co Cavan. Aidan studied under David in Wales and on his return he founded a monastery at Ferns. He became bishop there and was renowned for his generosity and kindness He died in 626 and his life testifies to his popularity both in Cavan and Ferns.

Friday 31st January - St John Bosco, Priest - Born in Piedmont 1815-88, founded the Salesians to educate boys for life. He also became involved in publishing catechetical material for youth. He is a patron saint of youth and of Catholic publishers.

Saturday 1st February - St Brigid, Abbess, Secondary Patron of Ireland - Born in 454 she was renowned for her hospitality, almsgiving and care of the sick. When she was young her father wished to make a very suitable marriage for her but she insisted in consecrating her virginity to God. The St Brigid's Cross, in legend used by Brigid to explain the Christian faith, remains a popular sign of God's protection.
